

A Jesuit colleague of mine was working in the inner city years ago and was asked did he need help. He said something that remained with me – 'don't come into these good people if you feel angry or guilty. The city has enough angry people, and we don't need your guilt. Come among them only if you love them'.

Two loves. One Love

The gospel today centres the message of Jesus on love; on two loves united in each of us. Love God, love the neighbour - this is the only commandment of Jesus. Without this all we say we do for him, is really done for ourselves.

No law of the church can be above the law of love. No detail of religious observance is above this law of love. Jesus said this. and lived it in his life. He never allowed the laws of religion overtake the need for love.

Human starvation took precedence over laws of not working on the Sabbath. Care for the sick takes precedence over Sunday worship. He was put to death because he put himself above the religious details of the people.
